

A SEVEN SESSION BEREAVEMENT

WORKSHOP is offered twice a year, in the fall and winter/spring, meeting in the parlor on the upper level across from the main sanctuary on alternate Thursday nights from 6:30 to 8:30 pm. The group discusses such topics as dealing with other people and family members, anger, guilt, reconciliation, and moving on. The group is open to people 18 years of age and up.

CAREGIVER SUPPORT GROUP meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 1 pm in the church library. It is a support group of caregivers and family members of those with serious illness or dementia, who meet to provide a consistent and caring place for people to discuss challenges of care giving. We share feelings, give and receive mutual support, as well as exchange information. Anyone is welcome to attend.

The mission of Greensburg United Methodist Church is to build bridges for people within and outside of our church so that they may know and experience a relationship with Jesus Christ. We believe that in a society that more and more isolates people from one another and from God that one method of building bridges is the formation of small groups that give people within the church more opportunities to know each other and also reach out to the community. Below is a list of small group opportunities connecting you to our church.

Greensburg United Methodist Church has something for you!

DINE TIME GROUPS include any adult in the church and their friends from outside the church as an opportunity to meet and have fellowship. The groups share a meal and then have an opportunity to discuss topics of interest to them. New members can join any time. Groups will change yearly to provide participants opportunities for fellowship with a new group of people.

DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY is offered both Tuesday mornings from 10 am to 12 pm and Tuesday evenings from 7 to 9 pm. It is a 34-week in-depth exploration of the Bible from Genesis to Revelations, and is open to all.

THRIVE is a Bible study open to all high school, college and post college young adults. This small group focuses on applying Biblical principles to 21st century life. Thrive meets every Thursday in the Library at 7pm.

MONDAY EVENING BIBLE STUDY meets on alternate Mondays for six week and focuses on specific topics such as who Jesus was and is, and how to step out in faith when God calls us. The group is open to all.

PRAYER GROUP meets each Wednesday evening from 6:45. This is a silent, intercessory prayer group for our congregation, our church, our community, the world, and us, based on Bible verses to focus our praying. People may stay as short or as long a time as they feel the need to.

FRIDAY MEN'S BIBLE STUDY meets at 7 a.m. Friday at Menches. The group solves the world's problems in about 30 minutes, studies scripture for about 20 minutes, and has breakfast. They're on the road by 8:25.

SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES

ARK – AMAZING ROTATING KIDS is for children in kindergarten through grade six. During a four week unit, the class groups visit Storytelling, Games and Activities, Arts and Crafts, and Cookery to learn the Bible lesson from different perspectives.

THE JR/SR HIGH SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS meets each Sunday in the Youth Room on the lower level. This group discusses topics important to them in today's society and is led by our director of student ministries.

CONFIRMATION CLASS is for students grades 7through 12. Bible structure, Jewish/Old Testament history, sacrifice and Christianity and its growth since the time of Christ are its main topics of learning/discussion. When completed, along with being baptized, the students become members of the United Methodist church. All students in the grades listed above are welcomed.

HOME IMPROVEMENT CLASS deals with the many issues of very busy families with children, from infant to teens. Discussions have a scriptural foundation. This is a high-energy and fun group, with many of the parents also teaching children's Sunday School or active in other church matters.

FRIENDSHIP CLASS includes a group of single and married adults who study a wide range of topics from short Bible studies to life application studies. All studies are scripture based. Many of the class members are involved in community activities. The class is an interactive discussion format.

PATHFINDERS is a group of adults interested in studying the Bible. The group picks one of the books of the Bible for discussion, reading it verse by verse and discussing what it says and its implications for lives today. Several interpretations of the verse may be read, but ultimately the decision is how God wants to apply it to members' daily lives.

SUPPORT GROUPS

CANCER SUPPORT GROUP meets the first Tuesday of the month in the Lower Level Library from 6 to 7:30 pm. It is open to anyone dealing with cancer, their spouses and families, and friends of those with cancer. Meetings include discussions and sharing of concerns, ideas and information. Often there is a speaker who may be an oncologist, oncology nurse, nutritionist, rehabilitation therapist, etc.

MAN TO MAN SUPPORT GROUP focuses on support and education for those dealing with prostate cancer. It meets in the Lower Level Library on the 3rd Wednesday of each month from 7-9 pm. Meetings include open discussion and speakers who address topics related to prostate cancer and quality of life issues.
