As I write this, we are preparing to enter another season in the church calendar. Lent is winding to a close and we will soon celebrate the Paschal Triduum – Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. These three mark the high point of the Christian year as we remember Christ's atonement on the cross and his triumph in the resurrection. These three close one season, but they also begin another – Eastertide. While we focus much of our celebration on Easter Sunday itself, for the next fifty days, we will be in the season of Easter.

You may ask, "why fifty days?" There are two reasons – one scriptural and one symbolic. Scripturally, Eastertide corresponds to the forty days Jesus spent with the disciples after his resurrection and before his ascension. After he was taken up into heaven, ten more days passed before the Holy Spirit came down at Pentecost. Our fifty days represent that time in the past. Symbolically, the season of Eastertide balances out the season of Lent. We spent forty days of fasting, mourning, and introspection as we prepared for Easter. Now, we spend fifty days celebrating Christ resurrection. The time of celebration is longer than the time of sorrow to remind us that Christ's grace exceeds our sin, and that the joy of the Kingdom will far outweigh sorrows experienced in this mortal existence.

You may also ask, "how do we observe Eastertide?" In the church, we number our Sundays according to the season so you will see them described as the, "2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter." The church also wears its beautiful Easter decorations until they are replaced with the bright red of Pentecost. Our lectionary readings focus on interactions between the risen Christ and his disciples. In general, the tone of our ministry remains centered on the joy of the resurrection.

Now, I have a question for you. How do you plan to observe Eastertide in your home life? I have to admit that Eastertide is not a season of the church I have lived out at home in the past. I'm sure we all have wonderful traditions for Advent. There are so many ways to celebrate Christmas. Many Christians have well-established traditions for observing Lent. Some of us fast or give up things. Others engage with new devotionals or attend extra worship services. Many people engage in charitable works for their friends and neighbors. I'm sure we can create similar traditions for Eastertide.

The season of Easter is about celebrating Christ's victory over death. Why not celebrate abundant life by planting an Easter Garden? You can brighten your yard or a public space with flowers. Some Christians celebrate by baking bread for friends and family. You can watch your dough rise and remember that Jesus also rose! If you gave up something for Lent, why not try adding something joyful for Easter? You could go on a daily walk and observe the changing seasons. You could listen to a beloved hymn each morning to start your day. Christ spent this time connecting with the disciples. You could use this time to reconnect with an old friend with a visit, phone call, or card.

In general, Eastertide is an invitation to take the joy of Easter Sunday and stretch it out through the season of Spring. How do you plan to bring the joy of the season into your daily life? In the days and weeks ahead, feel free to tell me your ideas and experiences. We may just find a host of new traditions to increase our joy as we proclaim, "Christ Is Risen!"

# **BED BRIGADE UPDATE—67 AND COUNTING...**

I continue to praise God for each of you and all the support provided to this mission. Please pray for this mission. May we have the grace, strength, and resources to continue to better meet the needs around us. We are making a difference, but there is much more need. At this writing, we have delivered 67 beds and have a waiting list for 20 more beds!! And requests for beds continue to be received.

# Our next build is Saturday, April 22nd, 2023. Our goal is to build 40 frames. So, save this date!

We plan to allow volunteers three start times, a slight modification from our January Build.

-Volunteers arriving at 9am will start decorating foot boards, assembling legs, and/or attaching hinges (tasks which must be completed first)

-Volunteers arriving mid-morning at 10am will begin assembling the frames, cleaning mattresses and assembling the bedding.

-We will begin delivering beds late morning, so volunteers wishing to help with this task can arrive around 11am. We will continue as long as we can or all requested beds are delivered.

This plan requires more coordination than we have had in the past. So, please let us know if (and when) you plan to volunteer by either using the online volunteer form on our website, sign up sheets outside the worship areas, call the office or, you can email Dick Stratton at: rwspersonal@gmail.com

Also, we need bedding:

- Twin XL sheets (with pillow cases)
- Twin XL mattress pads (zippered ones that enclose the entire mattress are preferred)
