MARDI GRAS PANCAKES AND BURNING OF THE PALMS SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 27 @ 4:30—6:30 PM

Ash Wednesday is March 2 this year. In order to prepare for the Lenten season, you are invited to gather as the faith community along with friends and family of all ages to a night of specialized pancakes and other breakfast goodies. Each person will fill out an order slip, then pancakes will be prepared by a safe crew of cooks, after which they will notify you when you order is ready.

Once our meal is over, we will move outdoors at 6 PM for a special service to burn last year's Palm Sunday palms to prepare the ashes for Ash Wednesday. Be sure to dress accordingly.


